First Grade Celebrates Haschalas Chumash

With glowing faces and unrepressed excitement, Rabbi Neuhaus's first graders marched onstage to share their long-awaited milestone with their delighted audience. Attired in white shirts and shiny vests, the boys sang with endearing gusto – for the first time in Yiddish – expressing their joy to begin learning “de heilige, zeese Torah!”

Rabbi Neuhaus shared the powerful mashal of the leaf who longed to be free and detached itself from the tree, only to wither away. We have to attach ourselves to the tree of life – Torah! Without Torah, Rabbi Neuhaus emphasized, we cannot survive.

Rabbi Muller then asked the audience why on Simchas Torah, fathers throw their sons in the air during “Moshe Emes.” The reason is, he explained, that unlike the children of Korach

who proclaimed “Moshe Emes” without their father, we celebrate the fact that from father to son, our emunah rings true. This is the glory of our mesorah.

The event was graced by the presence of Rabbi Dovid Nojowitz, Executive Director of Torah Umesorah, who was highly impressed by the moving performance.

As a final sweet touch to this memorable day, the boys were all presented with pekela and delicious Torah-decorated cupcakes.

To date, the class has already completed Perek Aleph in Bereishis. May they continue to go michayil el choyil, with everlasting hislahavus!






Kollel Zmanei Simcha: An Incredible Kiddush Hashem



Walk into the YTT beis medrash at 7:20 a.m., and you will be astonished to see dozens of sixth through eighth graders earnestly engaged in

Shnayim Mikrah – before Shacharis! This new program, Kollel Zmanei Simcha, established by the Davis family in loving memory of Simcha Davis a”h, has generated a mass commitment to be maavir sedrah, week after week. The immediate benefits are three-pronged: the boys are utilizing the extra 10 minutes prior to davening in a most meaningful way; their day is off to a wonderful start; and their davening is enriched with the lingering sweetness of



their learning. As Chazal have promised, those who are scrupulous in this area will be granted special brachos, including a long, fruitful life.

Each class has been assigned two “Roshei Kollel” who take attendance each morning. Those with a stellar attendance are awarded \$5 a month. In addition, all participants are treated to a gala seudah and an exciting trip at



the end of each sefer, as well as a chance to win mega raffles, such as a mountain bike. A “Board of Governors” oversees the incentives and ensures that everything is running smoothly.

Their enthusiasm was contagious: The fourth through fifth grades asked to join as well, and they now have their own thriving program in place.

It is a beautiful kiddush Hashem that so many boys have become dedicated participants of this unique morning Kollel.



A Visit from the Illinois State Secretary of Education

JDBY-YTT was privileged to welcome Illinois Secretary of Education Beth Purvis for a tour and visit last Monday.

The tour began with JDBY's Keshet division, as Secretary Purvis' professional background was in early childhood special education. She also observed several JDBY classrooms and interacted with students and staff, while absorbing the school's unique approach to religious and academic education.

After a roundtable discussion with JDBY's administration and lay leadership, she was driven to the YTT campus and given a tour of the facilities, classrooms, and the Beis Medrash.

At a discussion with the YTT professional and lay leadership, Secretary Purvis expressed a keen understanding of the dynamics of the Orthodox community and how these make a proposed scholarship tax credit program a beneficial investment for the state and an essential component of education reform. Secretary Purvis pledged to continue pushing for the passage of a school choice bill and welcomed Rabbi Soroka's input.

At the culmination of the visit, when Rabbi Soroka thanked her for taking the time to visit, Mrs. Purvis graciously responded, "No, it is I who must thank you for the opportunity to learn about such a wonderful educational system and beautiful community."



Our children's safety has always been a top priority at Joan Dachs Bais Yaakov. To this end, over the last number of years we have worked to create a Safer Schools Program for JDBY.

The protocols and policies of the program were made in collaboration with Project Shield and JCFS under the guidance of the Telshe Rosh HaYeshiva, Horav Avrohom Chaim Levin, שלי"טא and our Vaad HaChinuch.

It is a three pronged program that mandates staff education, parent education and student education. Two years ago, we introduced the Safety Kid® program to our parents and students. Created by Mrs. Debbie Fox, the program has been adapted to meet the needs of JDBY students in Nursery through 5th grade. Mrs. Rachel Zimmerman of Project Shield and our Jr. High Assistant Principal, Mrs. Bella Kaufman, developed a safety curriculum tailor-made for JDBY Jr. High students and approved by Horav Avrohom Chaim Levin, שלי"טא and by Horav Zev Cohen, שלי"טא. This year, we will once again teach the Safety Kid® program to our students during the month of December.

THIS WEDNESDAY EVENING, ז'כסלו, December 7, Mrs. Rachel Zimmerman will be presenting the Safety Kid® program once again for ALL MOTHERS. The session will take place אי"ה, in the JDBY library from 7:30 – 9:00. **All mothers are encouraged to attend** this informative session and become acquainted with the curriculum that will be taught to our children.
