Nachas for Generations!

On Sunday, May 28, a remarkable event took place at YTT - one that will not be forgotten by all those who experienced it. The third and fourth grades invited their fathers, grandfathers, and even great-grandfathers to come and learn with them, in honor of the upcoming Yom Tov of Shavuot. To the hanhalah's delight, the beis medrash was filled to capacity!

Rabbi Avrohom S. Brownstein, Executive Vice President, warmly welcomed the crowd and expressed the hanhalah's simchah at being granted the opportunity to unite fathers and sons in such a meaningful way.

The sight was too beautiful for words: four generations under one roof, bonded through the power of Torah! Some boys were sitting on their grandfathers' laps as they delved into the eternal words together.

Rabbi Nosson Muller, Menahel, spoke movingly, citing the Chazal that if there are three generations that are immersed in Torah, it is a guarantee that the Torah will always remain with, or return to, their descendants. Rav Chaim Volozhiner asked, but what about the Avos? They were the epitome of Torah, yet not all their descendants merited to live a Torah life! The Chofetz Chaim answered with a parallel to his own life: As he would go from door to door selling his sefarim, some people would answer the door, but others wouldn't, unaware that this "old man selling books"



was the gadol of the generation, offering his masterpiece that would eventually become the cornerstone of every Jewish home. Yes, the Torah is there for everyone - but first we have to open the door and allow the Torah to become part of our life.

Rabbi Muller concluded, "And when Zeidies coming knocking at the door to learn with their grandchildren, that's the best guarantee that their grandchildren will come back to learn Torah and welcome Torah into their lives. Because for Zeidies, we always open the door."

Many grandparents were visibly moved as the impact of Rabbi Muller's words resonated. The room was overflowing with warmth and a tangible ahavas haTorah. The learning session was extended by several minutes; it seemed as though each group wanted to continue forever.

Following this unforgettable chavrusashaft, each class then performed, featuring some of their impressive learning accomplishments this year. Rabbi Borenstein's class sang a stirring song about a ger tzedek sacrificing his life for Torah. They also celebrated a siyum on Parshas Vayigash. Rabbi Falik's class sang a dikduk song encompassing all the rules that they had mastered. Rabbi Steinberg's class performed a catchy song about yedios klalios. Rabbi Adler's class presented a beautiful Az Yashir.

Delicious refreshments were served: iced coffee, cake, as well as hot pretzels and popcorn.

May the special Torah bond created on that day reverberate for generations to come!

Dear Parents,

We are currently preparing for the coming school year. As we have done in the past, we are offering several options for online and computer terminal registration.

Options for registration are as follows:

1. Paper registration: Forms are available by request from the Business Office. Fill out the forms and submit them to the office. Please note: **We will be accepting paper forms until August 3rd. After that date, registration will be only online or at the terminals in the Business Office.**
2. Computer terminal registration: terminals will be available in the Business Office during regular office hours. A staff member will be available to help you through the registration process.
3. Online registration at your convenience from your home and office. Steps are as follows:
 - a. Go to www.jdbyyt.org/registration, use the username and password that you created last year or register using an email address that is already on record with the school and create a password.
 - b. After you get your confirmation email, log in. If you don't see your confirmation email, please check your spam or junk mail folders.
 - i. **Click on My Account**
 - ii. **Please complete the Emergency Forms pages for all your children.**
 - iii. **Then click on online registration, and follow the instructions for registration.**
 - c. Please note: **All** the forms and information are available on the registration website.
 - d. Until all forms and mandatory fields are completed the final 'Registration Payment' page will be locked and there will be a padlock icon on the page menu.
 - e. The final 'Registration Payment' page will provide an option make an ACH payment for registration or to mail in your payment. When you click submit on this page, your registration is complete and you will receive a confirmation email with a copy of your forms. If you do not see it, please check your spam/junk mail folders.
 - f. If you have any issues with the online registration, please contact the Business Office.





We are pleased to inform you that, in partnership with AI busing, we will be offering busing service for the 2017-18 school year. As there is no state of IL funding provided, the busing fees reflect the actual cost of the service.

Busing is available as follows:
 YTT AM Busing \$350 per child
 YTT PM Busing \$400 per child
 JDBY PM Busing \$350 per child

YTT will have morning busing for both Minyan students and at 8:30; YTT PM busing will include the 3:45 and 4:45 dismissals, as well as Friday dismissals. The \$400 bus fee for YTT PM includes the cost of hiring bus monitors. JDBY busing is for K-8 only; **there will be no nursery busing.**

Buses will be filled on a **first come first serve basis**. If a route to a neighborhood is full, all additional registrants will be placed on a waitlist pending sufficient demand for an additional bus. Please sign up as soon as possible to ensure your child's seat on the bus. Please include complete payment arrangements with your registration forms. The **final deadline** to sign up for busing is **Friday, June 30**. No registration forms will be accepted after that point. Registration forms unaccompanied by payment arrangements will NOT be accepted. Please note: This service is entirely run by JDBY-YTT. Please do not contact AI Bussing with any questions or concerns, as they will not be able to assist you.

All routes are subject to demand. JDBY-YTT reserves the right to cancel busing for any routes with insufficient demand. If a route you selected is canceled, you will be notified by August 3rd.
