



2ND SAFARI DAY IN 2ND GRADE

Mrs. Becker's second graders went on a safari to the African savanna. In connection with their elephant theme this year, it was not enough to just learn about elephants, the students wanted to experience them! So a safari trip was planned. An itinerary and preparations were made on our Smart Board. Bags were packed complete with camera, compass, binoculars, sunglasses, fans, snacks, and of course they wore their safari sun hats. Not only did they take a hike in the African savanna, (hallways of JDBY) they wrote in journals, made craft projects, listened to safari stories, and munched on a delicious snack of animal crackers, of course!



Pre MAKKOS FAIR IN PRESCHOOL

On Wednesday, the nursery and kindergarten kinderlach took part in a very special פסח activity. Ten different hands-on, developmentally appropriate, creative activities were prepared. Each activity represented one of the עשר מצות:

The children had a choice of all sorts of red collage materials to create their דם picture. They chose from tape, crepe paper, streamers, shiny paper, and felt. It was amazing to see how the children "measured" the streamers to see if the length they chose would fit on to the paper and how they problem-solved if it was too big of a piece.

מכת צפרדע

The children threw bugs into a giant frog mouth.

מכת כינים

Using bug rubbing plates and bug stencils, we created all sorts of bugs.

מכת ערוב

The children played an animal matching game, sewed animal lacing cards and dressed bears.

מכת דבר

The children dipped farm animal stamps into ink and pressed them onto paper. To show the animals were sick, the children stuck band-aids on to them. They enjoyed opening the band-aids all by themselves. They felt like real doctors.

מכת שחין

The children stuck circle stickers onto a person shape. Some children formed patterns with the different colored stickers.

מכת ברד

The children used all sorts of white materials such as a coffee filter, craft cups, and cotton balls to form ברד pictures. They even used red, yellow, and orange markers to draw fire.

מכת ארבה

Some children were patient enough to try creating a grasshopper from green play-dough while looking at toy model grasshoppers. Not only is this a great sensory fine-motor activity, but it sharpens observation skills, too.

מכת חשך

The children did scratch art. They used a scratch pen on special black paper to form pictures inside.

מכת בכורות

The children formed sad faces out of all sorts of materials.

All of these projects are displayed in the nursery building hallway along with pictures documenting the process of learning. Please come and take a peek at how children can learn through the exploration of different art media.




