CHOFETZ CHAIM HERITAGE FOUNDATION KAMOCHA PROJECT

This week marks the end of the first full week of the Kamocha project from the Chofetz Chaim Heritage Foundation. This is a new city-wide project that is being



piloted in Chicago. Last week, the תלמידים went to a big אסיפה, where they were treated to words of inspiration

from noted author Rabbi Yechezkel Spero and a powerful video presentation on the



topic of, "How would I feel if it was me?" The תלמידים made such a קידוש ד' that Yeshivas Tiferes Tzvi treated all תלמידים from grades 4 – 8 to doughnuts!



Then, in the days after the אסיפה the תלמידים made a class קבלה that will be worked on for the duration of the 4-week project. They also received a very cool

Foundation for making this קבלה. Throughout this past week, תלמידים worked on the

activity for the first week of the project – creating an ad campaign with a slogan to promote the קבלה. This project has been making a noticeable difference in recess and in the classroom since it has begun, בלע"ה.

YYT CLASS AT MISHNA UGEMARA COMES TO AN END

As the Yeshiva adds a new and exciting piece to its history, moving into the newest and most magnificent building, the 5th graders who spent nearly a full year in the original historic building of the yeshiva at Congregation Mishna U'Gemara deserve a special recognition. The Shul had no desks, just long tables, which seated up to four talmidim each. There was no student personal privacy. Just one push and everyone is displaced. There was nowhere to keep papers, pencils, books, or personal items except the tables or floor.

There was also no room for a break if they needed one; it's a shul, so they could not play

Despite these most difficult conditions, our class advanced in learning. More than that, our class advanced in the critical area of לחבירו. THE GROVE 1860 SCHOOLHOUSE

Last week we went to The Grove 1860 Schoolhouse. This things we saw were very different to how we do them in school now.

They used chalkboards to write instead of paper and many other things like that.

When kids got in trouble, they had to kneel on a bench in front of a chalkboard, and they had to hold two heavy logs without bending their arms. When someone didn't fold their arms on



their desk, they either had to sit on a one legged chair for five minutes (and if they fell they had to start the five minutes over again) or the teacher would tell

them to take their hands off the desk and hit it very hard to scare them.

We learned that in 1945, the school only had seven students so it had to close down. A year later it was burned down. Not so long ago, they found blueprints and built an exact copy of the school so students like us could come and see it!


YTT LIBRARY

PROJECTS IN 6R טומאה וטהרה

Before פסח, Rabbi Rosenberg's 6th grade learned the פרקים in the first half of ויקרא that teach the הלכות of טומאה וטהרה. The תלמידים did a great job learning these intricate הלכות, ones that many people do not know. As a conclusion to the לימוד, the class was challenged to make models of scenes that depict the transfer of טומאה. The תלמידים were graded based on creativity and accuracy in the הלכות and did a fantastic job!



ACIDS, BASES, VISCOSITY...OH MY!

The fourth grade came together to learn more about variables that may impact the success of their culminating science project-BUBBLES. Using a natural pH indicator, red cabbage, the boys deduced what the changes in color would mean. From background knowledge about citrus fruit, the boys knew that whatever color the cabbage water turned would imply acid. It turned bright pink! The hard part was finding a base. After trying numerous liquids, we discovered that club soda was a base. It turned bright green! The next day we learned about viscosity. Viscosity is the measure of thickness of a liquid or semi-liquid matter. Using marbles, water, dish soap, and corn syrup, the boys saw first hand how viscose greatly impacts the ability for another piece of matter to move in it. The debate is on: is a higher or lower level of pH better for bubbles? Will a higher or lower viscosity improve how big a bubble can get? We are waiting for warmer weather to start experimenting!



כמוך CAMPAIGN UPDATE AT JDBY

The מורות and תלמידות at JDBY have embraced the new Chofetz Chaim Heritage Foundation כמוך campaign with great fervor and enthusiasm.

On Tuesday night, May 3rd 2016, close to 20 מורות and administrators from JDBY joined Rabbeim and Moros of other area Day Schools at an Evening of Inspiration. Following an elegant dinner, Rabbi Shlomo Ornstein, Mr. Michael Rothschild and Rabbi Yechiel Spero electrified the crowd with a deeper meaning of the מצוה of "ואהבת לרעך כמוך." Based on the words of הלל הזקן, "דסני עלך לחברך לא תעביד," the concepts of thinking "How Would I Feel" really hit home. The Rabbeim and Moros of Chicago were charged with the זכות of "rolling out" a four week program that would keep students focused on this pivotal axiom.

The next morning, Wednesday, May 4, JDBY Talmidos in grades 4-8 boarded Agudah busses and were taken to the Holiday Inn in Skokie, IL. There, they joined hundreds of Talmidos from other area Day Schools. Rabbi Ornstein and Rabbi Spero spoke and then the riveting video "A Mile in Your Shoes" was shown. The message was clear and the girls left the gathering inspired to work on the מצוה of "ואהבת לרעך כמוך."

Later that morning, while the girls ate lunch, Mr. Rothschild came to our school and met with the Moros. Together, we tweaked and refined certain aspects of the program. The concept of a daily "journal" was introduced – for girls to record situations when they used the "How Would I Feel" concept to make a decision about what to do or say.


On Monday morning, ראש חדש אייר, the JDBY Student Council held a special ראש חדש activity. Girls in grades 4-8 broke up into their "families". Each "family" received a poster board and colored paper. Using markers, crayons, scissors, glue and a lot of creativity and חכמה, each "family" created a colorful slogan on their poster board. The poster boards were hung around the school to serve as a daily reminder. Every class took on a קבלה, signed the קבלה poster, and girls are encouraged to incorporate the "How Would I Feel" technique during recess or lunch and record their personal victories in their journals.

The video "A Mile in Your Shoes" was shown to grades 1-3 as well, and girls in those grades will be working on the "How Would I Feel" concept on their level.

Mrs. Morgenstern, one of our 7th grade Moros, created colorful HWIF badges that the 7th graders wear when they go to recess or lunch. In general, the כמוך campaign has swept JDBY up in an effort to improve our relationships with peers and siblings. We thank the Chofetz Chaim Heritage Foundation for, once again, stepping up and making a real difference in our lives.
