With the end of the Netilas Yadaim Project last week, the grand prize







6TH GRADE FRACTION COOKBOOKS

Mrs. Berger's sixth grade worked hard on their fraction cookbooks. This assignment was the culmination of their unit on fractions and a highlight of the year for the students. Using six recipes of their choice, the girls had to do mathematical computations such as doubling, tripling and halving the recipes. They each created a unique cookbook with these recipes. Extra points were awarded for creativity and execution. The girls were very excited about this project and used their artistic talents as well as math knowledge. The final products were outstanding both in their originality and accuracy! Cooking and baking are just two examples of some of the practical uses of fractions in everyday life and the girls have gained a new appreciation for the math lessons they have learned this year.



SELF RESPECT IN MORAH MEER'S SOCIAL SKILLS CLASS

The 1st and 2nd graders are reviewing why it is so important to have self respect. The girls know that everyone has talents and things that make them special. Most importantly, all the girls have beautiful נשמות that shine, which makes them worthy of respect no matter what! The girls had fun modeling different clay figures which depicted what helps them feel special. Most of all we had fun making our clay נשמה's shine.

THERE'S A LOT OF GREEN IN SECOND GRADE



Turtles aren't the only green subject we studied thoroughly this year in Mrs. Becker's second grade. The students have been very busy studying green topics in both math and science.

Mathematics has been green and practical. The girls have been learning about money, the value of coins, and how to make change. And these students are certainly mastering this topic! They have gone way beyond the math workbook engaging in activities that make this subject authentic and meaningful. They have counted bags of tzedakah collected by the nursery, were involved in coin counting centers, took part in role playing activities shopping for items and calculating the change due, and participated in smartboard team games involving calculating and counting coins. Each student completed a comprehensive money review booklet which entitles her to visit our class store next week and shop for items using coins and dollars. To complement our unit of study, the second graders will be taking a field trip this week to the Federal Reserve Bank to learn about the minting of money. This outing will complement our study and provide a wonderful opportunity to celebrate the conclusion of the school year.

Science has been exciting and very green! The students are learning about plants, plant parts and their important jobs. They have made 3D models of plants and of course have been busy in our classroom green house. The girls planted **Four O'clock** seeds, a variety of flowers, that are growing beautifully. We plan to take the plants home Erev Shavuot. They conducted experiments with our FOSS kits. In one experiment, the girls planted rye grass and alfalfa seeds and have been watering and watching their little lawns daily. The girls regularly write and draw observations and have recently mowed their lawns with a scissors. These lawns will continue to grow until they will be taken home and transplanted in to bigger gardens.

At JDBY, our girls have taken on the Chofetz Chaim Heritage Foundation “כמור” campaign” with true enthusiasm. Recess and lunch provide opportunities for practicing the “How Would I Feel” concept. Our girls are recording entries in their כמור journals that describe their struggles and successes. The following incidents are examples of the “כמור” impact in the upper grades:

In Mrs. Schwartz’s ו' כיתה, the קבלה of the class was “Not to Fight When Playing Ball.” Morah Schwartz bought the class a special ball labeled “כמור” Every girl signed her name on the ball and that is the ball they play with every day during recess.



One of our 7th graders was wearing her HWIF badge when she went to the orthodontist. When the Dr. asked her what it stood for, she explained the concept of “How Would I Feel.” The orthodontist’s eyes filled with tears and she said “I can’t believe your school teaches you such beautiful things.”




Mommy and Me in the Kindergarten



This application, together with your 2015 tax documents, should be submitted to the **Business Office** to be reviewed by the Tuition Committee. Please include a \$100 application fee made out to JDBY-YTT. **Forms submitted after June 17 will incur an application fee of \$250.**

- Computer terminal registration – terminals are available in the Business Office during regular office hours
- Online registration at www.jdbyytt.org/registration. Use the username and password that you created last year or register using an email address that is already on record with the school and create a password.

Enrollment Process for New and Returning Families

Financial Aid: Submitting your financial documents for the Tuition committee to assess your eligibility for scholarships. The first deadline for Financial Aid was on May 2nd, so you should have already submitted this information (if you did not yet, please see the previous page for details). BUT there are a couple more steps before school begins...

Registration: Updating or verifying all of the information we have on file for your family. Even if your child has been in school before, you need to re-register! If you complete this by the end of the school year, \$100 of your Registration fee will be credited to your tuition balance.

Medical Forms and Financial Arrangements: Requisite medical forms must be submitted, and tuition payments arranged before the start of the next school year. Finalize these before Aug. 1 and you will receive \$100 Give or Get for the 2016-17 year.

Admissions Packet: End of summer package of handbooks, admission cards and class lists. You will receive this in August ONLY once you have completed registration for your family, submitted all medical forms and finalized financials.


